

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-75

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE FINANCE DIRECTOR TO REMIT THE STOW MUNICIPAL COURT'S MONTHLY OBLIGATION OF ONE-HALF OF THE HIGHWAY PATROL FINES DISTRIBUTED TO THE COURT'S HOST CITY TO THE AKRON LAW LIBRARY IN ACCORDANCE WITH OHIO REVISED CODE SECTIONS 307.515, 3375.50(D), AND 4513.263(B), WITHOUT THE NECESSITY OF PUBLIC BIDS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to O.R.C. Sections 307.515, 3375.50(D), and 4513.263(B), the Stow Municipal Court has a monthly obligation to distribute one-half of the Highway Patrol fines distributed to the Court's host city to the Summit County Fiscal Officer; and

WHEREAS, this payment is exempt from public bidding pursuant to C.O.S. 173.07(a)(1)G and C.O.S. 173.07(b)(1)A; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.O.S. Section 173.11, multi-year expenditures in excess of the bidding limitations require legislative approval by this Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOW, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO:


SECTION 1. That the Finance Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to make payment to the Summit County Fiscal Officer for purposes of distributing the Stow Municipal Court's monthly obligation of one-half of the Highway Patrol fines distributed to the Court's host city pursuant to the terms and conditions of O.R.C. Sections 307.515, 3375.50(D), and 4513.263(B) for this year and each year thereafter that the Stow Municipal Court has this obligation in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code.


SECTION 2. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees or subcommittees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance was adopted pursuant to Section 4.11 Charter, and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety for the reason that timely payments must be made to avoid penalties, and, pursuant to Section 4.13 Charter, shall take effect upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise at the earliest period allowed by law.


