

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Stow City Council held on Thursday, November 17, 2016, at 7:00 p.m.

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### **Call to Order**

Mr. Razor called the meeting to order and Mr. Costello led the prayer and pledge of allegiance.

### **Reading of Communications**

The following correspondence was read or referred to by the Clerk:

1. Proclamation by the Mayor honoring the life of Colt, a deceased Police K-9. This item was read in its entirety.

Mr. Razor, on behalf of Stow City Council, stated they were devastated about Sergeant Miller's loss. He thought everyone in the room probably knew what it was like to lose a dog, but to lose a dog and a partner was terrible. Colt had made the City safer. They were indebted to him dearly.

Mayor Kline thought Councilman Razor had said it very eloquently so she didn't know what she could add, other than to say that she thought the most important thing was that while Colt was a great officer and a valued part of the police department, she knew he was loved very much while he was alive. She knew that Sergeant Miller and his family will miss him tremendously. She wanted to thank them for taking such good care of one of our own while he was with us.

A copy of the Proclamation was presented to Sergeant Stephen Miller.

Sergeant Miller thanked everyone. He knew Councilman Riehl was a big help in doing the fundraising with them when they initially were able to get Colt. They had built on from there and continued it. They had been able to do things with their program, including getting another couple of dogs. They would hopefully do the same.

He appreciated all the support of the people present this evening. They had received a lot of support. He hadn't known until his passing how much he had done in the community. There was a picture in the back of the room that was done by the Lakewood School. Their Art Teacher did it and all of the teachers signed it. They had received a bunch of cards from the kid at the different schools. It showed just how much Colt really meant.

Colt was not just out on the streets doing what he was supposed to be doing to protect everyone, but he also made a huge difference in public relations. That kind of went along with why he had picked him, because he knew he would be going in the schools. That really worked out.

He thanked everyone for their support.

Mayor Kline stated as everyone knew by seeing this outpouring of support and the support that the K-9 Program had enjoyed in the past, our K-9 Officers and their partners are very important to the City. They were very happy to have Spectrum and Mingo on duty now.

The City was committed to retaining and possibly even expanding their police K-9 Program. To that end, she wanted to recognize that they had had very generous donations already from members of the community who also share that vision of retaining and possibly expanding our K-9 Program. Therefore, she wanted to recognize some people who have already been very generous. Then tonight they would also be honored to accept a very generous donation from the Rubber City Kennel Club.

First of all, she wanted to thank Gladys Cobb, Diane Arnold, Doug and Deb Berkey, Mary Letieri, Dr. Kevin Artl and Grace Barryhill, who have all been tremendously generous towards our K-9 Fund. They would use their donations for the purchase and training of at least one more dog.

Also, tonight they were very happy to have Greg Brown, the President of the Rubber City Kennel Club, and many other members of the Club here. They had been very supportive of K-9 Officers and K-9s around the County in the past. This was no exception. They would be donating \$1,500 to the City of Stow for the purchase of a K-9.

Mr. Brown stated being part of the Rubber City Kennel Club was actually a fun thing to do. They were started by a small group of pure bred breeders and their veterinarian in 1940, shortly before the outbreak of World War II. The Club held its first AKC Sanctioned Match in 1941 at the East Market Street Gardens with a total of 530 dogs.

The Club has contributed money each year for nearly 20 years to the Akron-Summit County Public Library to purchase new or replace lost all breed dog books and magazines. For the last 10 years, the Club has donated \$5,000 annually to the Ohio State University's Veterinary School to deserving students to help with some of the cost of their tuition.

About 5 years ago, the Club began purchasing equipment for Police Department K-9 Units with the donation of nearly \$6,000 to the Akron, Cuyahoga Falls, Tallmadge, Brimfield, Stow and Copley Police Departments for vests for the dogs. They were very happy and proud to do it. They also donated to Happy Trails to help them rebuild the barn that was burnt in the fire to help with the situation of neglected and abused animals.

They have a meeting once a month, which was open to anyone. They would like people to become members, but the meetings were open to everyone. They were the third Tuesday of every month, except for the summer months when everyone was out showing their dogs.

They also had a lot of programs that go along with their meetings. They were very informative. People could learn a lot of things they had never thought of about dogs.

They sponsor an All-Breed Puppy Match in the fall at the Summit County Fairgrounds. On January 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> they would be sponsoring an AKC Sanctioned Dog Show at the Summit County Fairgrounds. Approximately 1,600 dogs are expected. That is open to the public. It is free. However, they did have a \$5.00 parking fee.

Mr. Brown gave Mr. Razor a \$1,500 check. They were very happy and proud to make this donation to the City for their K-9 Program. Mr. Razor gave the check to Finance Director Baranek. (Some pictures were taken.)

2. Proclamation from the Mayor proclaiming November 25<sup>th</sup>, 2016 as “Small Business Saturday”. This item was read in its entirety.

Mayor Kline thought this Proclamation said it well. She asked people to shop local and shop often.

### **City Officials’ Reports**

Mayor Kline reported as follows:

1. She wanted to call attention to an initiative that Mr. Rasor and her had talked about. She felt it was a really great idea that both Stow City Council and Munroe Falls City Council would hopefully be embracing. It had to do with the Veteran’s Banners that are displayed every year from Memorial Day to Veteran’s Day around the City. She asked Mr. Rasor to explain what they were talking about.

Mr. Rasor stated that everyone had seen the banners that they hang May until November. So they were asking students in grades 5-8 to provide an essay with photos or artwork of why they think a family or community member is worthy of recognition with a banner. The person who is submitted by the student must be a current or former member of the U.S. military.

There is going to be one winning entry from Stow and one winning entry from Munroe Falls. The City Council’s from those communities will select who the winners are. The winning students will be photographed with their banner and City Council members in the Spring of 2017. Essays are due on January 27, 2016.

Mayor Kline stated that the student from Stow who is selected will not only have the opportunity to have his/her picture in the newspaper, but his/her banner will be displayed at the intersection of Graham Road and S.R. 91. If she understood the City of Munroe Falls’ intentions, their winning student would have his/her banner displayed right near the Munroe Falls’ City Hall.

Mr. Rasor thought it was a great initiative. He thanked Mayor Kline for presenting it to them.

2. Wished everyone a very happy and safe Thanksgiving.

Director of Budget & Management Earle reported as follows:

1. He wanted to report on the City's \$2.00 increase in its Storm Water Fee.

They had had their first billing the last week in October. They had received comments from residents. They had sent out notices that explained the thinking behind the increase with the bills and the reason for it. It had gone very well. They had received a lot of good comments. People had asked about specific projects.

They would be having an updated plan of action thru the service department and the Mayor's office on the stormwater plan based on the exhibit that was attached to the ordinance that approved the fee with the budget after the first of the year.

Service Director Wren reported as follows:

1. Carvo would be on Kenneth and Progress Park tomorrow finishing the Paving Program. Also, on Monday, they would be doing some full-depth repairs that won't be actual resurfacing on Powell, Young and Norton Roads.
2. The Leaf Pick-Up Program was currently on schedule. They had about a half a road to finish in District 3 tomorrow. They would have six trucks deployed into District 1 to get a head start on that. They would come back and restart District 1 on Monday.

Mr. Razor asked if this was the second round for District 1? Mr. Wren stated Monday would be the official start. They were just getting a jump on it tomorrow.
