ORDINANCE NO. 2017-92

AN ORDINANCE BANNING THE PURCHASE, INSTALLATION AND USE OF TRAFFIC LAW PHOTO-MONITORING DEVICES TO ENFORCE TRAFFIC LAWS AT INTERSECTIONS CONTROLLED BY LIGHTED TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNALS OR TO ISSUE TICKETS OR FINES FOR SPEED VIOLATIONS.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Stow finds the use of traffic law photo-monitoring devices, also known as red light cameras, to enforce traffic laws at intersections controlled by traffic control signals unnecessary and undesirable and therefore seeks to permanently ban City of Stow from using said devices;

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Stow finds the use of traffic law photo monitoring devices to issue tickets or fines for speed violations unnecessary and undesirable and therefore seeks to permanently ban City of Stow from using said devices.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOW, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO:


SECTION 1. That City of Stow shall not purchase, install, or use a traffic law photo-monitoring device to enforce any traffic law violation, civilly or criminally, at any intersection where traffic is controlled by traffic control signals that exhibit different colored lights or colored lighted arrows.

SECTION 2. That City of Stow shall not use a traffic law photo-monitoring device to issue a ticket or other fine for any traffic law violation related to excessive speed.

SECTION 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees or subcommittees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.




