

Stow City Center

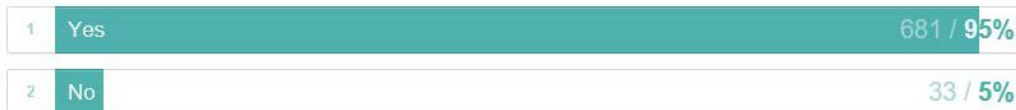


SURVEY RESULTS

A community survey was conducted from April 7th through May 1st, 2018 to assess appetite for particular features and strategies related to an urban, mixed-use redevelopment of portions of the Stow City Center site. 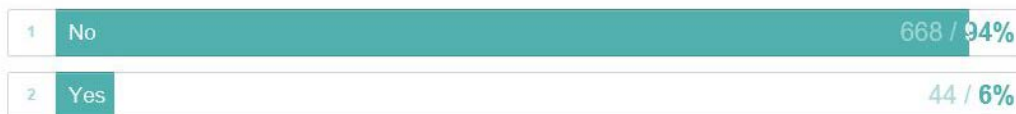
1. Are you a resident of the City of Stow?

714 out of 716 people answered this question



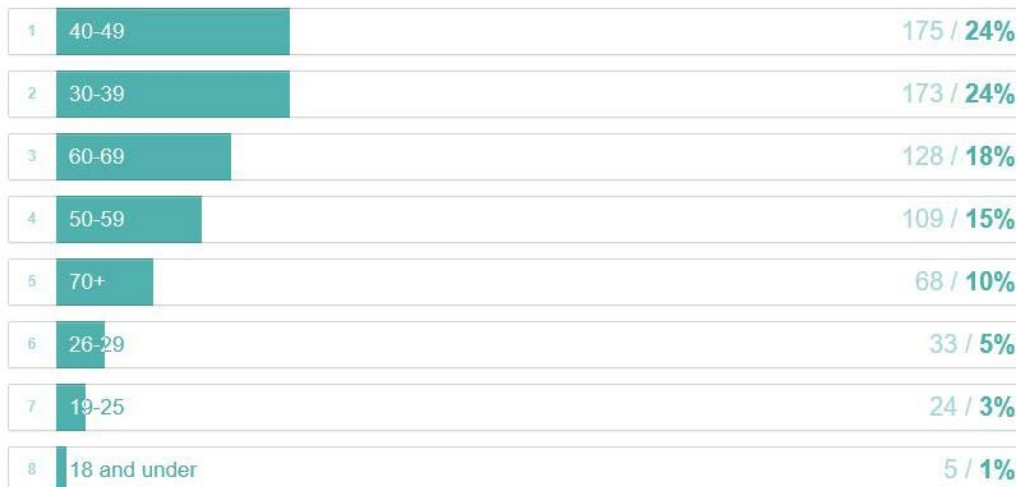
2. Do you own a business in the City of Stow?

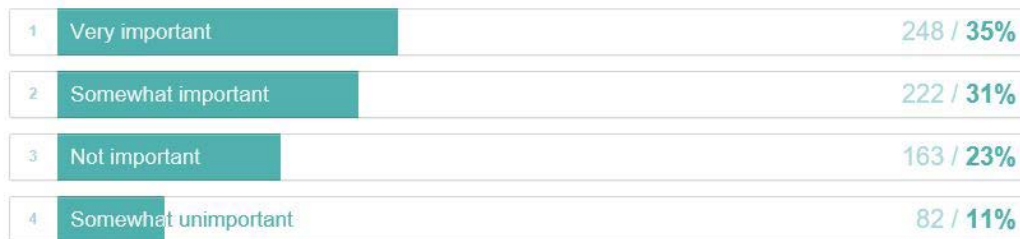
5. Do you own your home or rent?

713 out of 716 people answered this question



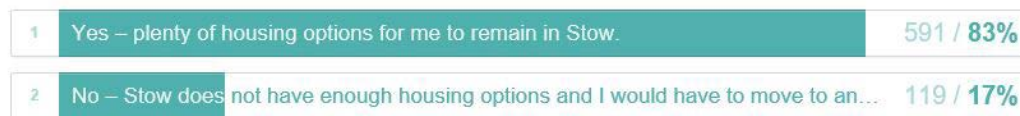
6. How much of a priority to you and your family is a downtown development on the City Center property?

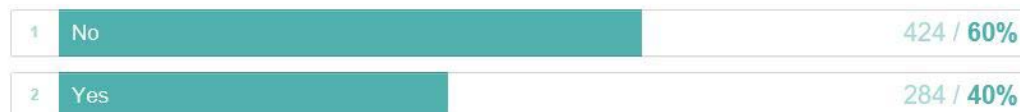
7. Do you think there are enough housing choices in Stow for you to be able to “up-size” or “down-size” through your life stages without having to leave Stow?

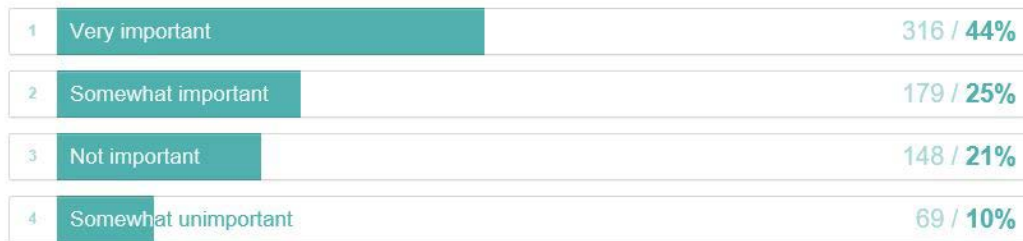
9. Do you think Stow needs to offer additional housing options to attract empty-nesters?

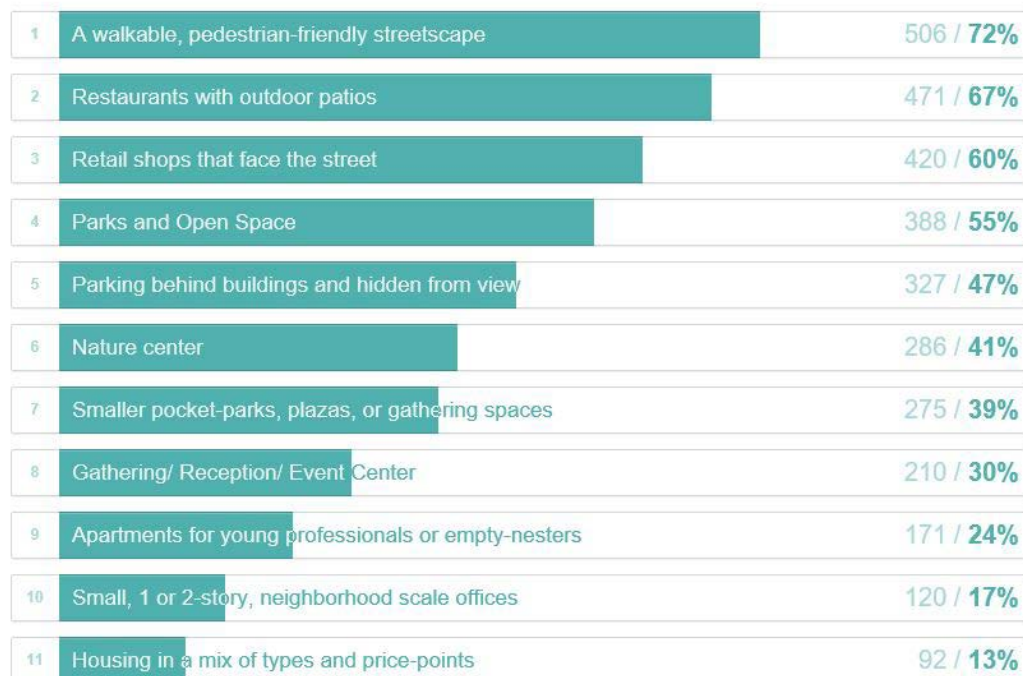
10. How important to you is it that the City consider the development of the City Center into a walkable mixed-use environment?

712 out of 716 people answered this question



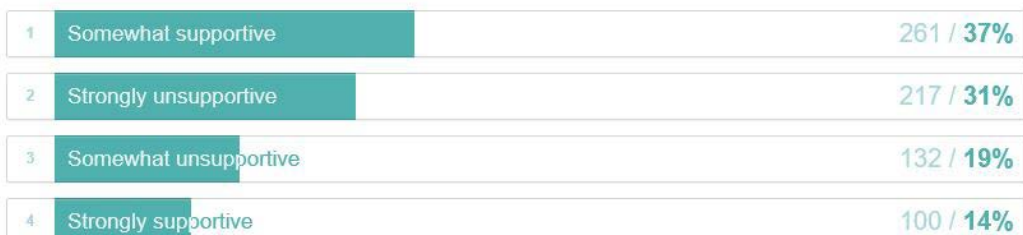
11. Which of the following land uses should be included in a walkable, mixed-use environment? (choose all that apply)

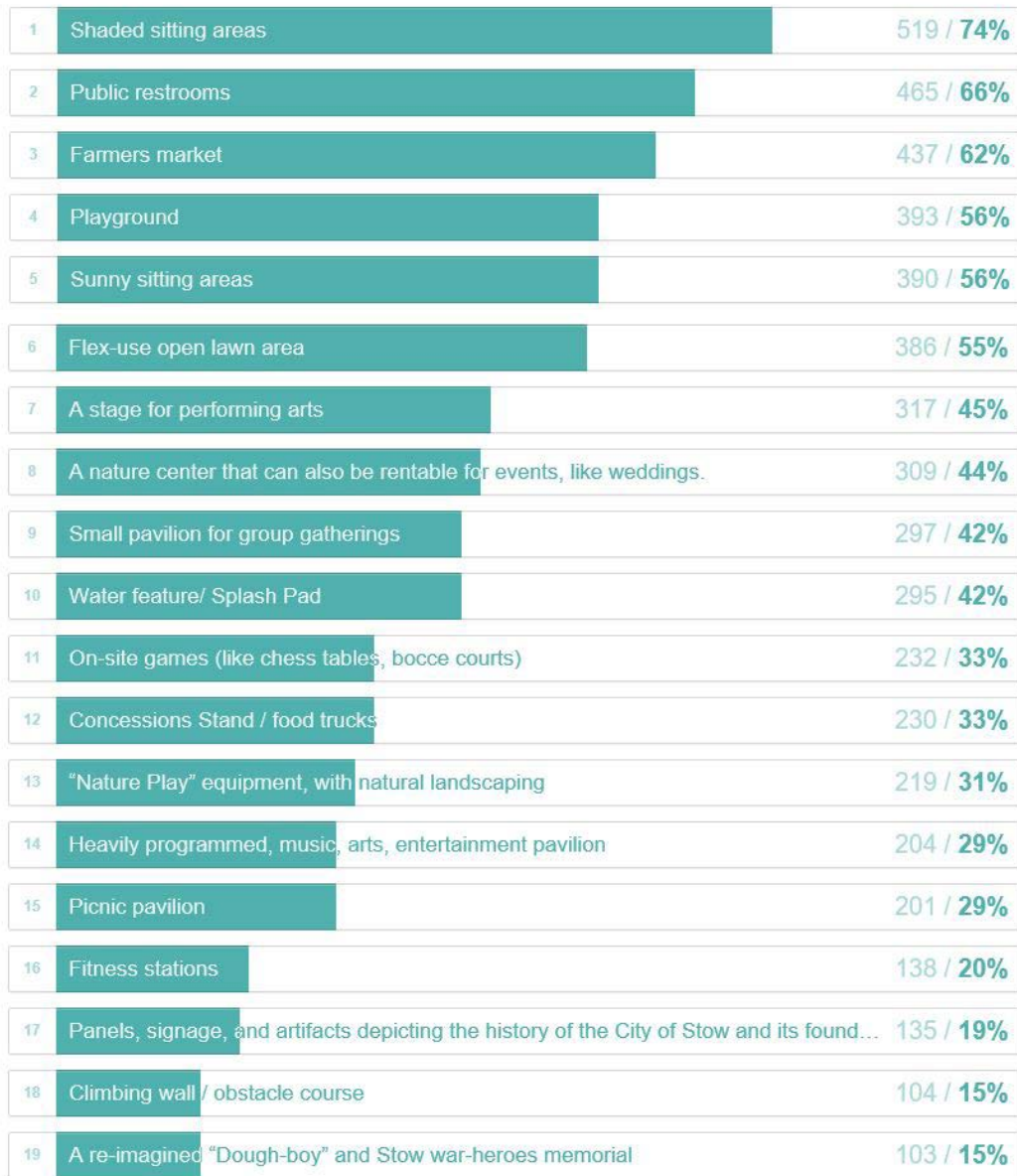

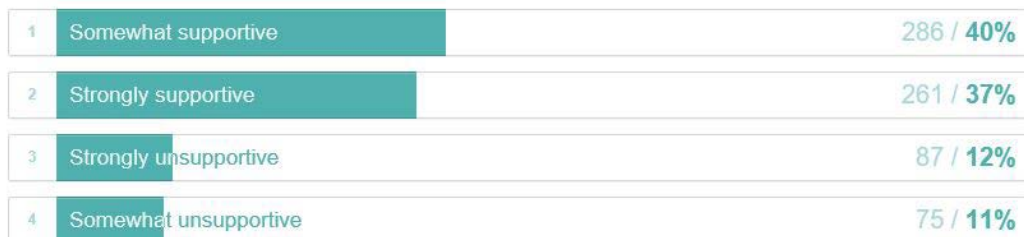
13. What public amenities and activities do you think should be included in the City Center development? (Choose all that apply)

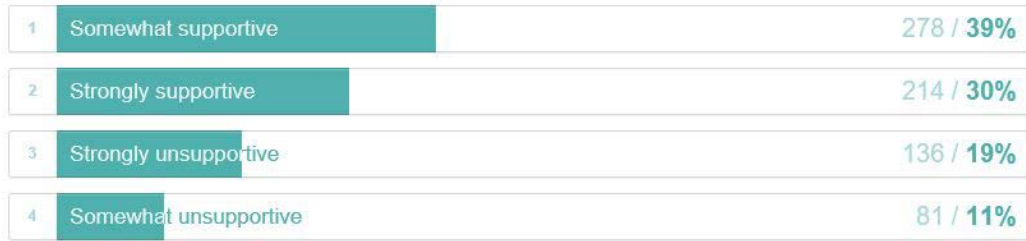
14. Would you support the relocation of the Senior Center if it were improved and expanded?
