

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2018-91, WHICH AUTHORIZED THE MAYOR TO MAKE AND ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH PATH MASTERS, INC., AN INTER-GOVERNMENTAL PROVIDER, FOR THE PURCHASE OF AN AUTOSCOPE VISION VIDEO DETECTION SYSTEM FOR THE INTERSECTION OF DARROW ROAD AND COMMERCE DRIVE, WITHOUT THE NECESSITY OF PUBLIC BIDS, BY INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF COMPENSATION TO BE PAID FOR SAID EQUIPMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOW, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 2018-91, particularly Section 2 thereof, which formerly read:

“SECTION 2. That the Finance Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to appropriate, encumber, and pay funds in an amount not to exceed Twenty Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Five and 00/100 Dollars (\$20,155.00) to Path Masters, Inc. for said detection system.”

be, and the same is, hereby amended to read henceforth as follows:


“SECTION 2. That the Finance Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to appropriate, encumber, and pay funds in an amount not to exceed Twenty Thousand Three Hundred Thirty and 00/100 Dollars (\$20,330.00) to Path Masters, Inc. for said detection system.”

SECTION 2. That all other terms and provisions of Ordinance No. 2018-91, and relating legislation not amended herein, be, and the same are, hereby reaffirmed as if fully reappearing herein.

SECTION 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees and subcommittees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.



That this ordinance was adopted pursuant to Section 4.11 Charter, and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety for the reason that traffic signals must be in operating order at all times, and, pursuant to Section 4.13 Charter, shall take effect upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise at the earliest period allowed by law.
