

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CITY OF STOW APPLICATION FOR A COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FOR AUDITORY CROSSWALK UPGRADES AT TWO INTERSECTIONS: GRAHAM ROAD/FISHCREEK ROAD AND DARROW ROAD/KENT ROAD THROUGH THE SUMMIT COUNTY'S 2019 CDBG PROGRAM AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Stow is applying for a grant through the County of Summit's 2019 Community Development Block Grant program; and

WHEREAS, the County of Summit would approve the same subject to the City's participation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOW, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the City of Stow would accept a Community Development Block Grant through the County of Summit's 2019 Community Development Block Grant program for auditory crosswalk upgrades at two intersections: Graham Road/Fishcreek Road and Darrow Road/Kent Road.

SECTION 2. That the Finance Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to utilize Fund No. 222 or such other fund as he may designate, for the purpose of receiving and distributing said funds.


SECTION 3. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to apply for and accept such grant award if approved, and enter into a contract on behalf of the City to implement the grant program in accordance with its guidelines and funding level.


SECTION 4. That the Council of the City of Stow, Ohio, does hereby agree to obligate funds required to satisfactorily complete the proposed project and thus become eligible for Community Development Block Grant funds.

SECTION 5. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and committees and subcommittees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.


SECTION 6. That this Resolution was adopted pursuant to Section 4.11 Charter, and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety for the reason that the City of Stow must meet a deadline in applying for the grant, and, pursuant to Section 4.13, Charter, shall take effect upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise at the earliest period allowed by law.
