

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-137

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2018-12, WHICH AUTHORIZED AN EXPENDITURE FOR THE FLEET REPAIR/MAINTENANCE OF VEHICLES FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT FROM PREFERRED SOURCE AND SOLE SOURCE VENDOR KLABEN FORD LINCOLN, INC., TO INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF THE EXPENDITURE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Stow City Council had previously authorized an expenditure with Klaben Ford Lincoln, Inc. for fleet repair/maintenance of vehicles for the Police Department in Ordinance No. 2018-12; and

WHEREAS, the cost for said services has increased; and

WHEREAS, the purchase is exempt from public bidding pursuant to C.O.S. 173.07(a)(1)G and C.O.S. 173.07(b)(1)D; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.O.S. Section 173.10, the total amount of the expenditure requires legislative approval by this Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOW, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 2018-12, specifically Section 1 thereof, which formerly read:

“SECTION 1. That the Finance Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to appropriate, encumber, and pay funds in an amount not to exceed Fifty Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$50,000.00) to Preferred Source and Sole Source Vendor Klaben Ford Lincoln, Inc. for the fleet repair/maintenance of vehicles for the Police Department for the year 2018.”

be, and the same is, hereby amended to read henceforth as follows:

“SECTION 1. That the Finance Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to appropriate, encumber, and pay funds in an amount not to exceed Seventy Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$70,000.00) to Preferred Source and Sole Source Vendor Klaben Ford Lincoln, Inc. for the fleet repair/maintenance of vehicles for the Police Department for the year 2018.”

SECTION 2. That all other terms and provisions of Ordinance No. 2018-12 and relating legislation not amended herein be, and the same are, hereby reaffirmed as if fully reappearing herein.

SECTION 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees and subcommittees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance was adopted pursuant to Section 4.11 Charter, and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety for the reason that the Police Department must maintain a reliable fleet of vehicles in order to insure a timely response to emergencies, and, pursuant to Section 4.13 Charter, shall take effect upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise at the earliest period allowed by law.


