ORDINANCE NO. 2019-15

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A SETTLE AGREEMENT WITH WILLIAM CLARK TO DISPOSE OF ALL PENDING LEGAL AND EMPLOYMENT CLAIMS AGAINST THE CITY AND AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE FINANCE DIRECTOR TO ISSUE SUCH PAYMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SAID SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this Council finds it is in the best interest of the City of Stow to resolve any and all pending legal and employment issues with William Clark.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOW, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized, on behalf of the City of Stow, to enter into a full settlement agreement disposing of all pending legal and employment issues between the City of Stow and William Clark. Said agreement shall be in a form approved by the Law Director and include a complete and final release of any and all pending legal and employment claims alleged by William Clark against the City of Stow.

SECTION 2. That the Finance Director be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to issue payment to William Clark in an amount not to exceed Twenty-Five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$25,000.00) in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the settlement agreement.

SECTION 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees or subcommittees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance was adopted pursuant to Section 4.11, Charter, and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety for the reason that it puts an end to any and all pending litigation and employment issues between the parties, and, pursuant to Section 4.13, Charter, shall take effect upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise at the earliest period allowed by law.
