Mrs. Mumper asked Mrs. Zibritosky if it would be possible for her to obtain from the Attorney General's Office all legal citations regarding the 5G being implemented in municipalities, exactly what the law says and to make that available to all residents to see in writing what it says?

It was her understanding from what she had read, and she might not be correct on it, but in 1996 when President Clinton passed this thru, they did eliminate any reasons to deny this for health reasons. She thought that was very interesting.

### **City Officials' Reports**

Mayor Pribonic reported as follows:

1. Mr. Trenner and him were still hitting the pavement visiting area businesses around the City of Stow.

Met with Mike Valentine from Binary Defense. It is a very unusual company. He thought it had room for expedient growth. They weren't up and running yet, but they should be very soon. They are a very unusual company that kind of looks like the science fiction world.

They are going to have a ribbon cutting in the near future. He asked Council Members to try to attend because it was something a little bit different than what we have in our community today. It is something they picked-up on. It is a very unusual and unique business. He had been very happy to see them.

2. Reminded everyone that the Veteran Banner Kick-Off will start on Tuesday, January 22<sup>nd</sup> and run thru Friday, April 1<sup>st</sup>. The cost of the banners stays the same at \$125.00. If anyone is interested, they should contact Ms. McDonnell in the lobby during normal business hours. Information is also on the City's Web Page.

3. Mr. Wren and him have begun preliminary budget meetings with all departments to assemble the budget proposal to both the Finance Department and City Council. Hopefully they will be able to present a budget in a very timely fashion so they can have some time to mull it over.

Finance Director Baranek reported as follows:

1. Still in the process of closing out 2018. They should be getting to that point shortly.
2. The annual audit has begun with inventories being taken prior to New Years. They will start working with the Auditors on that.
3. There is no bill listing this evening because they have not closed out the year yet.

Mr. Lowdermilk stated Mr. Baranek had sent them the Court's finances. He asked how many payments did they get and didn't get from them?

Mr. Baranek stated this year they did break even. They covered any operating deficit that they had. They also made payments towards the loans of approximately \$437,000. That pretty much takes care of the current portion of the debt.

Chief of Staff/Service Director Wren reported as follows:

1. Leaf season finally ended last week. They ended up doing a third pick-up. After that he and his two deputies took laps of District Nos. 1 and 2 and marked down any leaf piles that they could find. So after they picked-up those, they finally cleaned-up and put away the leaf machines hopefully for the year.

He wanted to thank the City's crews. They worked about five weeks straight of 12-hour days. Somehow the last two weeks of the season were the best weather weeks they had during the entire leaf season. He wanted to give them Kudos. They did a great job in getting the job done for them.

City Engineer McCleary reported as follows:

1. The Storm Sewer Crews are still working out there on Marhofer, at Wetmore Park and on Mohican. On Marhofer the road is now open.
2. He was also happy to report that ODOT will make both the signals at Seasons Road and S.R. 8 operational starting Monday. They have been on flash for the last week.
