

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO MAKE AND ENTER INTO A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT WITH THE SUMMIT COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT FOR PURPOSES OF PROVIDING PROFESSIONAL CONSULTING SERVICES FOR THE STORM WATER OUTFALL AND DRY WEATHER SCREENING, SAMPLING INCLUDING IDDE REGULATIONS AND COMPLIANCE AND UPDATES WITH THE CITY'S OUTFALL DATABASE FOR THE YEARS 2019 THRU 2024 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.O.S. 173.07(a)(1)B and 173.07(b)(1)G, the City of Stow is authorized by law to retain professional and technical services without the necessity of public bids;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOW, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor be, and he hereby is, authorized to make and enter into a professional services contract with the Summit County Public Health Department for purposes of providing professional consulting services for the storm water outfall and dry weather screening, sampling including IDDE Regulations and compliance and updates with the City's Outfall Database for the years 2019 thru 2024.


SECTION 2. That the Finance Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to appropriate, encumber, and pay funds in an amount not to exceed Thirty-Nine Thousand Six Hundred Sixteen and 08/100 Dollars (\$39,616.08) to the Summit County Public Health Department for said services.

SECTION 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees or subcommittees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance was adopted pursuant to Section 4.11 Charter, and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety for the reason that it is necessary to preserve the health and safety of the City of Stow residents as soon as possible, and, pursuant to Section 4.13 Charter, shall take effect upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise at the earliest period allowed by law.


