

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO MAKE AND ENTER INTO A CONTINUING CONTRACT WITH SENSUS/CORE & MAIN FOR PURPOSES OF UPDATING SENSUS ANALYTICS SOFTWARE FOR DAILY WATER READS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Stow is authorized by law to expend funds without the necessity of public bids to a sole source provider pursuant to C.O.S. Sections 173.07(a)(1)G and C.O.S. 173.07(b)(1)A; and

WHEREAS, Sensus Analytics is a cloud based platform providing more modern and reliable technology; and

WHEREAS, the current software has been in-place since 2006 and this upgrade will allow significant upgrades of two-way transmission of daily water reads as well as reduce our need for in-hour servers and maintenance since this will all be handled in the cloud; and

WHEREAS, it also uses intuitive, easy to navigate data to improve customer response time;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOW, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor be, and he hereby is, authorized to make and enter into a continuing contract with Sensus/Core & Main until either the expiration of the contract or the contract changes for purposes of updating Sensus Analytics Software for daily water reads.

SECTION 2. That the Finance Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to appropriate, encumber, and pay funds in an amount not to exceed Sixty-Eight Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-Nine and 24/100 Dollars (\$68,699.24) to Sensus/Core & Main for the first year of the contract for equipment, implementation and training and not to exceed Thirty-Three Thousand Five Hundred and 00/100 (\$33,500.00) per year to Sensus/Core & Main for years two thru five for annual maintenance and upgrades.

SECTION 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees or subcommittees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.


SECTION 3. That this Ordinance was adopted pursuant to Section 4.11 Charter, and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety for the reason that this would improve and enhance the water meter reading process and therefore increase efficiency throughout the city, and, pursuant to Section 4.13 Charter, shall take effect upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise at the earliest period allowed by law.
