

AN ORDINANCE CONFIRMING THE MAYOR’S APPOINTMENT OF BRENDAN MACKIN AS LAW DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF STOW TO FULFILL THE UNEXPIRED TERM OF LAW DIRECTOR AMBER K. ZIBRITOSKY CONCLUDING JANUARY 2, 2020 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Law Director Amber K. Zibritosky has resigned as the City of Stow’s Law Director as of March 5, 2019 to take a position with the Stow Municipal Court; and

WHEREAS, due to her resignation, a vacancy in the office of Law Director for the City of Stow occurred as of March 6, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor, pursuant to Section 9.05 of the Stow City Charter, has the authority to appoint a temporary appointment for up to 75 days with confirmation of Council required to continue upon such time; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor appointed Assistant Law Director Brendan Mackin for that 75 day period; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Stow wishes to confirm his appointment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOW, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the appointment by the Mayor of Brendan Mackin as Law Director of the City of Stow be, and the same is, hereby confirmed by this Council effective as of April 26, 2019 until January 2, 2020. Upon completion of the unexpired term he shall return to the position of Assistant Law Director.


SECTION 2. That the Finance Director be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to pay said Brendan Mackin in accordance with Ordinance No. 2008-268 and any amendments thereto.


SECTION 3. That Brendan Mackin shall be entitled to life insurance, health insurance, medical and dental benefits, workers compensation benefits, participation in PERS or Social Security, and participation in the City’s PERS/SSI Pickup Programs, such as may be legislated for all other executive managerial positions.

SECTION 4. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees or subcommittees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 5. That this Ordinance was adopted pursuant to Section 4.11, Charter, and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety for the reason of ensuring that sufficient Law Department staffing is in place to carry out the responsibilities as assigned by the Charter of the City of Stow, and pursuant to Section 4.13 Charter, shall take effect upon its adoption by Council and approval of the Mayor, otherwise at the earliest period allowed by law.


