

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO MAKE AND ENTER INTO A THREE-YEAR CONTRACT WITH WAN DYNAMICS FOR PURPOSES OF UPGRADING THE NETWORK THAT SUPPORTS THE 911 DISPATCH CENTER AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Stow is authorized by law to expend funds without the necessity of public bids to a professional services and preferred source provider pursuant to C.O.S. Sections 173.07(a)(1)B and C.O.S. 173.07(b)(1)D; and

WHEREAS, this contract is to lease equipment for three years that will provide redundant connectivity at the K.S.U. and Stow sites and new equipment at the Tallmadge and Mogadore sites that will allow improved manageability and security for those connections; and

WHEREAS, this configuration will replace three existing AT&T lines and will result in a \$52,988 savings the first year and \$53,688 savings in the subsequent years;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOW, COUNTY OF SUMMIT AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor be, and he hereby is, authorized to make and enter into a three-year contract with Wan Dynamics for purposes of upgrading the network that supports the 911 dispatch center.

SECTION 2. That the Finance Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to appropriate, encumber, and pay funds in an amount not to exceed Eighteen-Thousand Four Hundred Twelve and 00/100 Dollars (\$18,412.00) to Wan Dynamics for the first year of the contract and not to exceed Seventeen Thousand Seven Hundred Twelve and 00/100 (\$17,712.00) per year to Wan Dynamics for years two and three each.

SECTION 3. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees or subcommittees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance was adopted pursuant to Section 4.11 Charter, and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety for the reason that it will provide a reliable communication system for our safety forces in order to better serve the public, and, pursuant to Section 4.13 Charter, shall take effect upon its adoption by Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise at the earliest period allowed by law.
